In 2009 the Napanee District Community Foundation supported 13 community based initiatives. Grants were given to the following organizations:

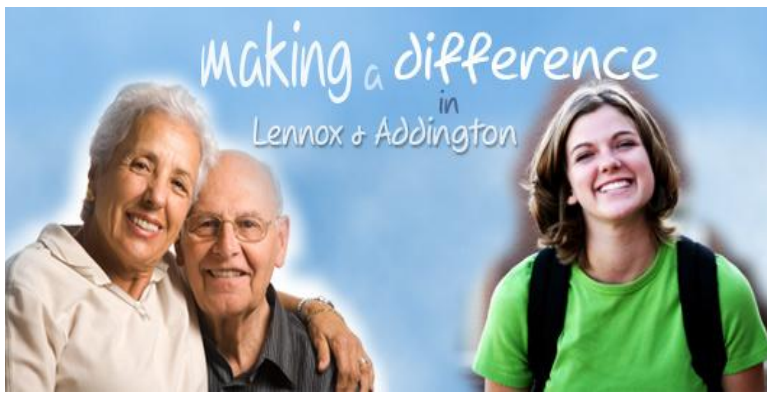

### **Charlotte Uens Scholarship Fund**

The Charlotte Uens Education Scholarship Fund is open to students of Napanee District Secondary School only. The Fund is open to students pursuing post secondary education either through University, College or an Apprenticeship program. Application forms are available at the NDSS Guidance Department, the Napanee District Community Foundation office, or on our web site [www.ndcf.ca](http://www.ndcf.ca). The number of scholarships will fluctuate from year to year depending on capital investment returns. Beginning in 2010 The Charlotte Uens Education Fund will provide one year scholarships towards tuition costs in the following areas:

- University scholarships \$6,000 (maximum)
- College scholarships \$3,500 (maximum)
- Apprenticeship scholarships \$1,000 (maximum)

Students who successfully receive a Charlotte Uens Scholarship may re-apply for future consideration.
